Lie down in a prone position.	This tells your dog you are about to start walking with a nice loose leash.
Kick all four feet out so the dog is standing on all four feet.	Release word. They can stop doing the previous command.
Rump on the floor and front legs are straight.	Releases the dog to eat a dropped or tossed cookie.
Get all four feet on the floor and off whatever they were on.	Go over to their mat and lie down and wait until released.

<p>The dog places its front feet onto an elevated surface such as a stair.</p>	<p>Lift front feet to fix tangled leash.</p>
<p>Come within reach of the handler (from a distance).</p>	<p>This is a short-term pause. (ex. doorways and meals).</p>
<p>Dog shifts weight to hip/side while in a down.</p>	<p>Don't move. Release when near the dog, not at a distance.</p>
<p>Elimination command (limit the time and the area given).</p>	<p>Jump, so four feet are all on a surface.</p>

Go under a surface (such as a table) and lie down.	Go into a crate.
Go ahead of the handler, through a doorway or tight space, and then turn to face the handler.	Back under a chair and lie down facing forward.
Fall in-line behind handler (for tight spaces).	Dog stands parallel to you on your left side.
Back up in a straight line.	Dog stands parallel to you on your right side.
